## NE/IZLIJEČENI SVECI

Izložba *Ne/izlječeni sveci* iznikla je iz višegodišnje suradnje Ureda za kulturna dobra Zagrebačke nadbiskupije i Odsjeka za konzerviranje i restauriranje umjetnina Akademije likovnih umjetnosti Sveučilišta u Zagrebu.

U toj je suradnji tijekom nastave, restauratorske prakse i diplomskih radova do sada spašeno, istraženo, konzervirano i restaurirano četrdesetak skulptura i dvadesetak štafelajnih slika iz fundusa Dijecezanskoga muzeja Zagrebačke nadbiskupije.

**DIJECEZANSKI MUZEJ?** Muzej je osnovao bl. Alojzije Stepinac (1939.), a organizirao ga je i stručno njime upravljaо u prostoru tzv. Znlike kurije na Kaptolu 28 kanonik Kamilo Dočkal. Sa skupinama svojih izložaka vezanih uz sakralnu tematiku, prikupljenih iz crkava i kapela tadašnje Zagrebačke nadbiskupije, Dijecezanski se muzej ubraja među najvrednije takve ustanove u Hrvatskoj. Međutim, danas nije otvoren za javnost, nema svoj izložbeni prostor niti funkcioniра kao muzejska ustanova.

**NE/IZLIJEČENI?** Silom loših političkih i materijalnih prilika muzej kao javna ustanova prestaje djelovati (1971.), a većina umjetnina desetljećima je pohranjena u nepovoljnim uvjetima. Skrivene od javnosti, nevalorizirane, nedostupne, prepustene ubrzanom propadanju – čekaju bolja vremena.

**IZLOŽBA!** Ovom se izložbom, smještenom u znakovitom i autentičnom prostoru nanovo otklučane Domitrovićeve kule na Kaptolu, pokazuje do sada nedostupni dio vrijednosti muzejskog fundusa, ali i zaboravljeni i okrnjeni dio sakralne baštine sjeverozapadne Hrvatske.

**STUDENTI...** Prije svega se pak javnosti predočavaju rezultati rada studenata koji su pod vodstvom mentora ugradili stotine i stotine sati u složene procese istraživanja, konzerviranja i restauriranja skulptura - izabranih po kriteriju ugroženosti njihova stanja - da bi prenijeli dio toga gotovo nestalog blaga u budućnost.

**...I POSJETITELJI** / Interdisciplinarnost konzervatorsko-restauratorske struke naglašena je i predstavljena suradnjom s humanističkim i prirodoslovnim znanostima, a interaktivna radionica koja će „uživo“ trajati tijekom ove izložbe omogućit će posjetiteljima da dotaknu ne/izlječene i uključe se u utiranje novih puteva zaštite i očuvanja naše (sakralne) baštine.

## UN/CURED SAINTS

Exhibition *Un/Cured Saints* is the result of years-long cooperation between the Office for Cultural Heritage of the Archdiocese of Zagreb and the Department of Art Restoration and Conservation at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb.

Until now, through teaching, restoration practices and diploma works of students this cooperation rescued, researched, preserved and / or restored about 40 polychrome wooden sculptures and 20 oil paintings from the holdings of the Diocese Museum of the Zagreb Archdiocese.

**DIOCESE MUSEUM?** The museum was founded by Archbishop Blessed Alojzije Stepinac (1939) and it was organized and led under the expert guidance by Kamilo Dočkal in so-called Znka's curia on Kaptol 28.

With groups of exhibits related to religious themes, collected from churches and chapels of the then Archdiocese of Zagreb, the Diocese Museum ranks among the most valuable of such institutions in Croatia. However, today it is not open for public, it does not have its own exhibition space or functions as a museum institution.

**UN/CURED SAINTS?** Due to bad political and financial situation museum as a public institution was closed (1971), and for decades most of artworks were stored in unfavourable conditions. Hidden from the public, unevaluated, unavailable, left to rapid deterioration – they were waiting for better times.

**THE EXHIBITION!** This exhibition, set up in a revealing and authentic surroundings of recently unlocked Domitrović Tower on Kaptol, shows so far inaccessible part of the valuables in the holdings, but also forgotten and truncated part of sacred heritage of north-western Croatia.

**STUDENTS...** First of all, the public in turn is presented with the works of students, who were mentored and worked for hundreds and hundreds of hours in the complex processes of research, conservation and restoration of sculptures – which were selected according to the criteria of vulnerability of their state – to transfer part of this almost missing treasure into the future.

**...AND VISITORS** Interdisciplinary nature of conservation and restoration is highlighted and presented in cooperation with the humanities and natural sciences, and an interactive workshop that will be held “live” during this exhibition will allow visitors to touch the non/cured and engage in paving new ways of protecting and preserving our (religious) heritage.
